Tass Abu Saada knows first-hand what it means to be gripped by hopelessness. Born in the Gaza Strip in 1951, his parents immigrated to Saudi Arabia shortly after his birth. Desperate for a change, Tass moved to the United States in 1974, married an American girl (Karen), and became successful in business. Although he enjoyed his life in the U.S., Tass realized the people of his homeland were still trapped in a cycle of violence, poverty, and despair. In response, he and his wife founded Seeds of Hope, a non-profit organization intent on making a difference one life at a time.

"We recognize the way to provide a better future for these people is to physically instill hope into their communities," explains Tass. "By providing basic needs such as nutritious food, education and jobs, we can also show them a more profitable way of living. By coming alongside them, we establish a working, peaceful community that gives hope where there once was none."
